SPIRITUAL GROWTH SUGGESTED READING

As another academic year begins, schedules tighten and bulge with the abundance of choices that we are blessed with living in a university community. In Tish Harrison Warren's book *Liturgy of the Ordinary, sacred practices in everyday life*, she simply asks the reader to notice the holy that is woven into each day. She looks for God in the ordinary events of waking up, losing one's keys, sitting in traffic. Connecting the liturgical calendar to our everyday calendar, Warren considers how the practice of living according to the church's calendar orients us to a hopeful future, "rooted in the past in the person of Jesus of Nazareth and in his promises and resurrection" (p. 108). Practicing patience, humility, and trust, we grow into the Body of Christ. In the chapter titled "Liturgical Time and the Unhurried God" Warren writes: "Our hope for a future of shalom motivates us to press toward that reality, even in our ordinary days. Our work, our times in prayer and service, our small days lived graciously, missionally, and faithfully will bear fruit that we can't yet see" (p.113).

CAMPAIGN AND CELEBRATION! (almost)

It is time now and always to say THANK YOU to all who have pledged and contributed to our Capital Campaign. While we have not yet met our goal of \$1.1 million, we should all feel a sense of pride that we have been able to raise almost \$904,000 during a transitional period for our church. This amount has allowed us to achieve most of the goals that were voiced in our strategic plan survey: most importantly securing the life of Kirklea (for another 100 years) as well as addressing critical parking lot and safety issues.

We had planned to wrap up the campaign much earlier, but Mother Nature has thrown some unexpected curve balls in the form of flooding and structural damage which introduced new capital needs. Some Campaign funds have been directed toward those immediate needs, requiring that we make a few more cuts to our scope to stay within our current budget.

With this in mind, our plan is to keep the campaign open through **early September**. We are hopeful that some of you who have not yet given might be pleased with the results of the projects so far, and that you will consider pledging or contributing at this time.

That said, we are truly grateful for all of the participation we have had! In appreciation, we will create a plaque in the lobby of Kirklea, listing the names of all who have given. If you have done so but wish not to be listed, please contact us or the church office. We will use names as they appear in the church directory. Please check to see that your name is correct and as you would like to see it listed. If there are changes that you wish to make, please contact us.

Finally, we have so much to be thankful for as partners in this faith community called St Paul's, Ivy. We think it is time to acknowledge this! Please mark your calendars for the evening of Tuesday, October 23. Look for more information to come...and be ready to kick back and celebrate all of the blessings that we share as the family of SPI.
